OPEC+ Increases Oil Output as Hormuz Exports Recover

OPEC+ has agreed to further increase output targets from August, adding to global supply as oil prices fall following the reopening of the Strait of Hormuz. Core members including Saudi Arabia and Russia hiked quotas by nearly 800,000 barrels per day since April, aiming to stabilize prices around \$72 per barrel.

Japan Bankruptcies Hit Record High Due to Plunging Yen

The Japanese yen has fallen to a 40-year low, driving bankruptcies among smaller firms to an all-time high with 45 companies failing in the first half of the year due to currency issues. While large exporters benefit, import costs have

squeezed profit margins for businesses unable to pass on higher costs.

Wage Growth Peaks as Inflation Indicator Flattens

Wage growth peaked four years ago and has been steadily declining, leading to decreased inflation expectations and a flattening relationship between wages and CPI. Analysts argue wage growth is now a more reliable indicator of future inflation than CPI, suggesting a slowdown in inflationary pressures.

Food Retailers Face Headwinds from SNAP Benefit Cuts

Average benefits per SNAP participant have declined sharply under efforts to reduce fraud, with enrollment falling to 37 million people. Major retailers like Walmart and Kroger face potential headwinds as cost shifts could lead to further benefit tightening at the state level.

EasyJet Agrees to £5.2 Billion Takeover Deal

EasyJet has reached an agreement in principle with US investment firm Castllake on a potential takeover offer worth around £5.2 billion. The deal requires regulatory clearances but marks a significant shift for one of Europe's largest airlines.

Benedict's Law Mandates Allergy Training in Schools

England is introducing 'Benedict's Law' requiring schools to implement measures to keep children with allergies safe, including emergency response plans and medication stockpiles. The regulations become statutory duties by 2027 following the death of a student due to an allergic reaction.

Nigel Farage's close friend Richard Cottrell was involved in a high-profile money laundering scandal, having agreed to launder money for undercover agents in an FBI sting operation. Cottrell served eight months after a plea deal, raising questions about his association with Farage.

Romania Coalition Collapses as USR Quits PSD Partnership

The coalition between the USR and PSD parties has ended as trust to govern together was lost, with USR Minister Oana Țoiu stating they will not accept an alliance again. The crisis highlights differences in platforms, with USR advocating for structural reforms and PSD aiming to halt them.

Bitdefender Revenue Nears \$500 Million Ahead of IPO

Cybersecurity firm Bitdefender experienced 11% revenue growth to \$480 million in 2025, with plans to list on the stock market by December 2028. The company holds \$363 million in cash and remains a major market player with significant operations in Romania.

Romania and Ukraine Draft Protocol to Prevent Drone Incidents

Romania and Ukraine are discussing a protocol to prevent incidents like the explosion of a drone in Port Constanța, requiring Ukrainian authorities to inform Romanian counterparts if they lose control of drones. The agreement aims to reduce security risks and improve communication between the two countries.

Hungarian PM Magyar Launches Plan to Dismantle Orban Regime

Stokes was caught at Helsinki airport and extradited to the US to face charges for conspiracy and cyber intrusion.
