Trump Announces US-Iran Deal Despite Regional Tensions US President Donald Trump has confirmed that a memorandum of understanding with Iran is set to be signed within hours, aiming to reopen the Hormuz Strait and halt ongoing conflict. The announcement comes despite complications arising from an Israeli attack on a Hezbollah command center in Beirut, which Trump criticized as lacking discernment. Ethereum Proposes Quantum-Proofing for Just 7 Cents The Ethereum Foundation's Kohaku project lead has unveiled a cost-efficient solution to protect accounts against future quantum-computing threats without requiring a hard fork. Romania

President Nicușor Dan Nominates Adrian Veștea as Prime Minister Romanian President Nicușor Dan has unilaterally appointed Adrian Veștea as Prime Minister, a decision made without prior consultation with leaders of the ruling coalition parties. The move has sparked a political crisis, with USR rejecting the hypothesis of supporting a Veștea government and PNL facing internal division.
