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Judge Orders Google To Make Rival App Store Installs Easier

A federal judge has ordered Google to remove barriers that make it difficult for rival Android app stores to be discovered and installed on Google Play. The order is part of the remedies following Epic's antitrust victory, which requires Google to carry competing app stores inside Google Play and provide access to its full app catalog. Judge James Donato's decision aims to undo Google's alleged monopoly over Android apps, which was found illegal by a jury in 2020. Google must now remove unnecessary steps that make rival app stores harder to install, starting within the next week. Google's implementation of third-party app stores in its Play Store was deemed insufficient by US District Judge James Donato, who ruled that the company added unnecessary anticompetitive friction to the process. The ruling comes after Epic and

Google reached a global partnership agreement to address the issues. However, the two are still on opposite sides of an ongoing antitrust case in the US, with Google losing the previous case in 2023. As part of the court's remedies, Google was required to include third-party app stores in the Play Store, giving users easy access to non-Google apps. Aptoide Games became the first such app store and was only added after Google's initial efforts to settle with Epic were rejected. Google's implementation was found to be confusing, with the link to the alternative app store page buried several levels deep in the menu. Even searching for app store or Aptoide did not yield the intended results, according to Epic lawyer Yonatan Even. This ruling matters because it underscores the ongoing regulatory scrutiny of Google's anticompetitive behavior and its impact on user choice and innovation. The case highlights the challenges of balancing competition with the need for app store management and moderation. By including third-party app stores in the Play Store, Google is being forced to adapt to changing market conditions and consumer demands. This move matters as it seeks to promote competition among Android app developers and provide consumers with more choices. The changes are part of a larger effort to break down barriers between competing app stores on Google Play. Epic Games' victory in its antitrust lawsuit has set an important precedent for regulating tech giants' market dominance. By removing anticompetitive friction, the judge aims to level the playing field and ensure that all Android developers have equal access to the platform. The ruling is a significant development in the ongoing debate about tech antitrust and competition. Compliance monitoring will be enforced by the court over the next year.

Google Will Allow Users To Remove Visible Watermark From AI Generations

Google has announced that it will now allow users to remove a visible watermark from its AI-generated content, including images, videos, and songs. The change will be rolled out in the coming days and will be available for users of Gemini models. Josh Woodward, Google's VP for Gemini, stated that the toggle will also be available in the video editor, Flow, with support for Search coming soon. The visible watermark is now optional, but invisible SynthID watermarks and C2PA metadata will still be used for transparency. This change reflects a balance between creative control and safety, as evident in the evolving approach to labeling AI-generated media. Google's move comes after Anthropic's decision to include a watermark in text and files generated by Claude to comply with EU regulations. The company is also open-sourcing a new library called Credentio to let developers embed a local validation mechanism in their apps. This change matters as it addresses concerns around the utility of AI-generated content for professional and creative work. By giving users more control over the watermark, Google aims to strike a balance between safety and creativity. Google has introduced an update to its AI tools, Gemini and Flow, allowing users to remove visible watermarks from images, videos, and music generated with these tools. The new Media watermark setting can be toggled off, removing the sparkle watermark that appears in the bottom-right corner of content. However, AI-generated content will still have invisible SynthID watermarks and C2PA metadata embedded in the background. This change may make it more difficult to quickly detect if a piece of content is AI-generated. The update matters because many users have already been editing out visible watermarks, and this change may level the playing field for other AI image generators like OpenAI and Meta. Google plans to roll out this feature to Search as well, but will not be available in countries that require visible watermarks. Josh Woodward, vice president of Google Labs, Gemini, and AI Studio, announced the update. Other companies, such as Anthropic, are also applying invisible watermarks to their AI-generated content. This development is significant for the AI industry, as it seeks to balance user convenience with the need for content verification. Creators have long argued that visible marks hinder professional usability. The shift aligns with industry trends toward invisible authentication methods.

Trump Slaps a 100% Tariff On Heavy and 'Sensitive' Drones

US President Trump has imposed tariffs of up to 100% on heavier drones, including those with docking stations or thermal imaging, due to national security concerns. The affected drones are commercial models used for operations such as power line inspection and search and rescue. DJI, a leading drone manufacturer, is among the companies impacted by these tariffs. In contrast, smaller drones will face a 25% tariff. The White House claims the measures aim to strengthen national security and encourage US drone manufacturing. Key locations include the United States, where the tariffs are being imposed, and China, which may be affected by the impact on DJI's global operations. DJI has expressed concerns about the potential disruption to their business. This decision matters as it highlights ongoing tensions between the US and China in the tech industry, and could have implications for the global drone market. The tariffs may also affect search and rescue operations, crop spraying, and other industries reliant on drones. Industry analysts warn that the sudden cost increase could delay critical infrastructure projects across the country. Some rescue organizations have voiced alarm over the potential price hikes for essential equipment. The administration argues that domestic manufacturing capacity must be bolstered to reduce reliance on foreign technology. Critics suggest that the tariffs might stifle innovation rather than promote it within the US market. Supply chains involving Chinese components could face significant disruptions in the coming months. The move aligns with broader trade policies aimed at decoupling certain tech sectors from Chinese influence. Legal challenges from affected companies are expected to follow in federal court. International partners are watching closely to see how this affects global trade agreements. The long-term impact on consumer prices for drone technology remains uncertain. This policy shift represents a significant escalation in tech-focused trade restrictions. Economic repercussions are expected to be felt within the next quarter.

What We Know About the Alleged Iranian Hacks on US Water Utilities

Several US water utilities have been hit by coordinated cyberattacks, allegedly carried out by Iranian hackers, causing widespread concern across the country. The affected states include Minnesota, Arkansas, Georgia, New Jersey, and Michigan, with over 150,000 water systems targeted in total. President Donald Trump initially denied the attacks were carried out by Iran, creating confusion around the attribution. Tim Walz, the Democratic governor of Minnesota, was targeted by Trump's claims regarding the incident. The US Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) warned of Iranian hacker activity in April prior to these incidents. The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) is suspected to be behind the attacks on critical infrastructure. The attack highlights the vulnerability of critical infrastructure in the US, particularly water utilities, which can have devastating effects on public health and safety. The psychological impact of the attacks should not be underestimated, as they have caused widespread panic and fear among residents. The incident also underscores the need for improved cybersecurity measures and cooperation between government agencies to prevent such attacks in the future. Federal investigators are currently working with state officials to secure the compromised systems. Residents in affected areas have been advised to monitor water quality reports closely. The timing of the attacks coincides with heightened geopolitical tensions in the Middle East. Cybersecurity experts warn that water systems remain some of the least protected critical infrastructure nodes. This event marks a significant escalation in state-sponsored cyber operations against US utilities. The response from the White House has been mixed, with conflicting statements issued by different officials. Person Hides Prompt Injection In Legal Filing Telling AI To Side With Them

An anonymous plaintiff, Matthew Elliott, attempted to manipulate an artificial intelligence system (LLM) in a Connecticut court by hiding instructions in his official filings. These prompt injections were designed to influence the AI's output and favor his position in the case. The court discovered these hidden messages after reviewing the filings and issued a sanction decision against Elliott. The judge, Walter Spader Jr., noted that while the manipulation attempt was unserious, it raised serious concerns about the potential impact of AI on the legal system. Key people involved include Matthew Elliott, Walter Spader Jr., and the New York Bariatric Group, which is being sued by Elliott. The case matters because it highlights the need for safeguards to prevent similar attempts to manipulate AI systems in court proceedings. The ruling also underscores the importance of human oversight in reviewing documents and detecting potential manipulation attempts. The outcome, while allowing the case to proceed, imposes significant restrictions on Elliott's electronic filing practices. The main event or finding is that prompt injection attacks on court systems have been ineffective, but experts warn that courts will need to draft rules around this technology due to its rapid advancement. Connecticut courts are focusing on policing AI outputs that damage trust in courts, but prompt injections pose a new challenge. Judge Spader suggests that attorneys may unknowingly let their clients use prompt injections to manipulate court filings without their knowledge. This issue is particularly concerning for pro se litigants who often rely on chatbots to build their arguments. Pro se litigants are using chatbots in a way that hurts their cases, as they ask the chatbot to advocate only for their position without considering opposing arguments. This approach can lead to sycophancy and entrench litigants in their arguments despite any ruling to the contrary. Judge Spader warns that this is a genuine hazard of the technology and one that judges now see often. The issue reaches beyond Elliott's case, with potential implications for the fairness and integrity of court proceedings. Experts emphasize the need for caution and critical thinking when using AI tools in the courtroom. Legal ethics boards are beginning to discuss specific guidelines for AI usage in filings. The incident serves as a warning to lawyers about verifying all content generated by AI tools. Future court rules may explicitly ban hidden instructions within digital documents.

Berkshire Hathaway Shifts Strategy Under Abel with Major Tech and Aviation Bets

Berkshire Hathaway has signaled a significant shift in investment strategy under new CEO Greg Abel, deploying capital from its record cash hoard into major technology and aviation stocks. Recent filings reveal the conglomerate increased its stake in Alphabet Inc., the parent company of Google, by purchasing 48.1 million shares worth approximately \$37.8 billion as of midyear. Simultaneously, Berkshire added 17.5 million shares of Delta Air Lines, valued at \$5.37 billion, marking a substantial bet on the travel sector's recovery and growth. These moves contrast with previous periods of cash accumulation, suggesting Abel is confident in deploying Warren Buffett's legacy capital into growth-oriented sectors. Alongside these acquisitions, the company trimmed positions in Bank of America and Kroger, indicating a rebalancing of its financial and consumer staples exposure. The investment activity also included stock repurchases, further demonstrating management's view on intrinsic value. Market analysts view this aggression as a testament to Abel's independence and willingness to diverge from Buffett's historical caution in certain areas. The sheer scale of the Alphabet purchase makes Berkshire one of the largest shareholders in the tech giant, aligning it closely with the artificial intelligence boom. Delta's addition highlights a continued belief in consolidated airline profitability despite economic

fluctuations. Investors are closely watching whether this deployment rate can be sustained given the massive cash reserves still on hand. The strategy underscores a transition phase for the company as it moves further into the post-Buffett era. Financial advisors note that the diversification into tech and travel reduces reliance on traditional insurance and utility holdings. This activity comes amidst a broader market rally, where Berkshire's moves often signal confidence to institutional investors. The timing suggests Abel is prioritizing growth opportunities over defensive cash positioning in the current economic climate. Overall, the quarterly transactions represent one of the most active investment periods for the firm in recent years.

Luigi Mangione Pleads Guilty in UnitedHealthcare CEO Killing

Luigi Mangione has pleaded guilty to federal stalking charges and admitted responsibility for the killing of UnitedHealthcare CEO Brian Thompson, ending a prolonged legal uncertainty. The plea agreement exposes Mangione to a maximum sentence of life in prison, along with significant restitution and fines mandated by the court. During proceedings, Mangione cited deep-seated frustration with the American healthcare system following a personal back injury as the primary motivation for the attack. This admission brings closure to a five-day manhunt that concluded with his arrest at a McDonald's location in Pennsylvania last year. The Thompson family expressed gratitude for the federal justice system's role in holding Mangione accountable while advocating for a sentence that reflects the gravity of the loss. UnitedHealthcare issued a statement praising law enforcement efforts and offering continued condolences to the loved ones of the deceased executive. Anthropic Faces Backlash Over AI Watermarking Compliance

Anthropic is facing significant user backlash after implementing a watermarking feature on text generated by its Claude AI models. The decision was driven by compliance requirements under the European Union's AI Act, which mandates transparency regarding AI-generated content. Since the announcement, dozens of subscribers have canceled their plans, citing concerns over attribution, authorship, and potential professional complications. The watermark is designed to be imperceptible to readers but identifiable by software, aiming to distinguish machine output from human writing without altering quality. Tech analyst Ben Thompson criticized the move, arguing that crediting AI models with ideation is absurd when they function merely as tools for human users. Anthropic defended the feature, stating it is essential for maintaining trust and adhering to emerging global regulatory standards. The company plans to release an API allowing users to verify

the presence of the watermark independently. Competitors like OpenAI are also exploring similar watermarking processes, suggesting an industry-wide shift toward transparency mechanisms. However, critics argue that such measures could degrade the user experience and stifle creative workflows dependent on AI assistance. The controversy highlights the tension between regulatory compliance and user retention in the generative AI sector. Some users are migrating to alternative platforms like Cursor and Grok that currently offer less restrictive policies. Anthropic maintains that the watermark does not change the meaning of the text but ensures accountability in content creation. The debate extends to legal implications, particularly regarding copyright and liability for AI-assisted work. Industry observers note that this could set a precedent for how AI companies handle government mandates in the future. Despite the friction, Anthropic remains committed to the rollout as part of its safety-focused corporate mission. The situation underscores the growing pains associated with integrating advanced AI into professional environments.

FBI Investigation Clouds Record \$12.5 Billion Lakers Sale

The record-breaking \$12.5 billion sale of the Los Angeles Lakers is facing scrutiny following reports of an FBI investigation into seller Mark Walter. Federal agents seized electronic devices belonging to Walter and associates at Guggenheim Partners months before the transaction was finalized. The probe centers on whether Guggenheim Investments properly recorded revenue within its private-investments business, raising questions about financial transparency. Despite the investigation, the sale to a group led by Josh Kushner and former Disney CEO Bob Iger proceeded, marking one of the largest sports transactions in history. Walter, who purchased control of the team previously, is reportedly facing a cash crunch that necessitated the sale of the franchise. The seizure of devices belonging to Guggenheim Investments President Dina DiLorenzo indicates the depth of the ongoing inquiry. US Accuses China of Orchestrating 'Great Transshipment Scam'

The US government has released a damning report accusing Chinese exporters of orchestrating a massive tariff evasion scheme known as the Great Transshipment Scam. According to the White House, goods are being routed through over 40 third countries with minimal processing to disguise their Chinese origin and avoid US tariffs. Vietnam has emerged as a central hub for this practice, alongside other Southeast Asian nations implicated in the supply chain manipulation. The report estimates that billions of dollars in goods have been diverted since 2018, resulting in tens of billions in lost US

revenue. White House senior counselor Peter Navarro highlighted the issue as part of escalating trade tensions between Washington and Beijing. Senators are urging intensified crackdowns on these schemes, citing displaced American jobs and unfair competitive advantages. China's embassy in Washington condemned the report, warning that actions targeting third-party countries could harm global industrial supply chains. The administration plans to utilize artificial intelligence to monitor trade flows and identify transshipped goods more effectively. This development comes ahead of President Xi Jinping's scheduled visit to the White House, complicating diplomatic negotiations. Economists warn that such evasion undermines the effectiveness of existing trade policies and tariffs. The practice involves minor assembly or labeling changes in transit countries to qualify for lower tariff rates. US manufacturers argue this creates an uneven playing field that threatens domestic production capabilities. The report confirms long-standing suspicions regarding the integrity of certain import data from Southeast Asia. Trade experts suggest this could lead to new sanctions or stricter rules of origin enforcement. The situation reflects the broader geopolitical struggle over manufacturing dominance and trade balance.

Multiple Drone Incursions Detected Across Romania

Romanian authorities have confirmed multiple drone incidents across the country within a single day, raising security concerns along the eastern border. Wreckage was discovered on the beach in Saturn, marking one of several locations where debris was found. The Ministry of National Defense announced the discovery of another crashed drone in Plauru, Tulcea County, following an alert from a local resident. This incident follows another discovery in the Măcin Mountains, bringing the total to at least four drones found in Romania in 24 hours. Defense Minister Radu Miruță stated that army radars detected over 100 drones in the proximity of the border over the last four days. Most of these aerial vehicles were destroyed by Ukrainian air defense systems before crossing fully into Romanian airspace. Officials emphasize that there are no indications that the risk level for the general population has increased despite the frequency of incidents. Fragments from some drones were recovered from a post office in Costinești, suggesting they were carried by wind or water. An expert team from the Ministry was dispatched to investigate the fragments and determine the exact origin and type of each device. The surge in activity highlights the spillover effects of the ongoing conflict in neighboring Ukraine. Authorities continue to monitor the situation closely to ensure national security is not compromised. Public communication remains focused on preventing panic while maintaining vigilance among border communities. The findings underscore the complex security environment in the Black Sea region. Cooperation with allied nations remains a key component of the response strategy. Further updates are expected as the investigation into the wreckage concludes.

Energy Grid Stabilized by Prosumators Amid Reactor Shutdown

Romania’s energy system faced significant strain following the shutdown of a nuclear reactor for maintenance. Prime Minister Ilie Bolojan addressed the crisis by outlining new legislative measures to support grid stability. He emphasized the need for prosumators to install batteries and inverters that can be dispatched by suppliers. The goal is to reduce costs for providers while encouraging higher levels of self-consumption among households. Experts credit prosumators with battery storage for effectively saving the energy system during peak demand hours. Corina Murafa, an energy expert, highlighted the crucial role these decentralized resources played in stabilizing the grid. Dan Pîrșan from the Association of Prosumers noted that it was a collective effort that prevented broader disruptions. The government plans to unlock hydroelectric projects to increase water levels on the Danube River. This project, known as Bala 2, aims to double the river's debit but may take three years to complete. Energy shortages are expected to worsen in coming weeks

due to regional heatwaves and drought conditions. Importing massive amounts of energy during peak hours remains a temporary solution while infrastructure is upgraded. The situation exposes Romania's vulnerability to reliance on nuclear power during maintenance cycles. Long-term planning now focuses on integrating renewable sources more effectively into the national grid. Consumers are being asked to consume electricity in moderation during peak hours to assist the effort. These measures aim to prevent future crises as the country transitions its energy mix.

David Popovici Makes History at European Swimming Championships

Romanian swimmer David Popovici has achieved a historic feat at the European Swimming Championship. He won the 200-meter freestyle event, adding to his earlier victory in the 100-meter freestyle. This accomplishment makes him the first swimmer in history to win both events at three consecutive European Championships. His previous titles were secured in Rome 2022 and Belgrad 2024, cementing his legacy in the sport. Popovici dominated the competition by taking the lead from an early stage and maintaining his advantage. Romania Secures Major Penalty Reduction from EU Commission

Romania has successfully negotiated a significant reduction in penalties imposed by the European Commission. The fine related to not meeting the EU's renewable energy targets has been reduced tenfold. The original penalty amount was €500 million, but it has now been lowered to €50 million. Dragoș Pîslaru, interim minister of Investments and Projects Europe, led the negotiations with Brussels. UK Extreme Weather: Wildfires, BBQ Ban & Train Chaos

The UK is currently grappling with severe extreme weather conditions characterized by record-breaking temperatures and widespread wildfires. Authorities have implemented a temporary ban on the sale of disposable barbecues to mitigate the heightened risk of fires igniting dry vegetation. Thousands of firefighters are working in difficult conditions across the country as hundreds of incidents are reported daily. The West Midlands has been particularly affected, with ambulance services treating dozens of casualties from fires spreading through urban areas. Climate scientists warn that human-induced climate change is driving these more frequent and intense heatwaves. The UK is on track to break a record number of wildfires in 2025, with nearly 1,000 incidents already reported this year. Compounding the travel disruption, a train derailment in Essex has led to significant chaos for commuters. Mangione Pleads Guilty in Healthcare CEO Murder

Michael Mangione has pleaded guilty to federal charges related to the murder of UnitedHealthcare CEO Brian Thompson. Afghanistan Five Years Under Taliban: Women's Rights & Western Influence

The ban on secondary and higher education for girls remains strictly in place across most of the country. UN officials argue that engagement is slow and incremental but must be maintained to achieve meaningful change. Georgette Gagnon emphasizes the importance of collective effort and consistent messaging in negotiations. The UN is adopting a new process called Mosaic to approach negotiations in a more structured format. Critics have accused the UN of not pushing back enough against the Taliban regarding women's rights. Despite this, officials argue that a stalled process is better than no process at all. The situation matters because the denial of education perpetuates gender inequality and restricts opportunities. Humanitarian access and the treatment of prisoners remain key areas of focus for international delegates. Ultimately, the UN believes it must stay the course to improve the overall well-being of Afghans.

Eurovision Organisers Propose Rules to Curb Political Voting

Samsung health AI models analyse wearable biosignal data

Samsung Research America has presented two new AI foundation models. These models are named xMAE and HiMAE and are designed for wearable biosignals. They learn from data such as heart activity, sleep, and physical activity. The models aim to support predictive healthcare solutions for consumers. They analyze physiological relationships in wearable data to generate insights. Sharanya Desai is the Head of Digital Health Algorithms at Samsung Research America. She emphasized the significance of the research in delivering efficient health insights. The goal is to provide precise health insights through a health foundation model. xMAE connects cardiac signals that measure related activity within the body. HiMAE analyzes data across multiple time scales to identify patterns. It generates user guidance directly from consumer hardware devices. The models were accepted to the International Conference on Machine Learning. They were also accepted to the International Conference on Learning Representations. Samsung reports that xMAE outperformed existing multimodal learning methods significantly. It succeeded in 15 of 19 evaluation tasks during testing phases. This showcases its potential for cardiovascular disease prediction and abnormal test-result detection. HiMAE achieved high performance with a smaller model than existing ones. It can produce results in less than one millisecond on a smartwatch-class CPU. The models have the potential to support continuous care and prevent health issues. This research matters as it brings forward new technologies for wellbeing.
