Romsilva Leadership Summoned Over Illegal Contracts

Romania's national forestry company Romsilva is facing intense scrutiny following revelations of significant procurement irregularities. An official report from the National Agency for Public Procurement (ANAP) has uncovered that contracts worth 28.25 million lei were attributed without proper publicization. This action stands in direct contravention of established procurement regulations designed to ensure transparency. The scale of the issue is highlighted by data showing Romsilva used this non-transparent procedure 82.75% of the time. This percentage far exceeds the legally allowed threshold for such exceptions. In response, interim Minister of Environment Diana Buzoianu has decided to convoca the Romsilva leadership for an emergency meeting. The meeting will take place at the Ministry of Environment

to demand immediate explanations. ANAP President Raluca Rogoz is also involved in highlighting these critical findings. The incident raises serious concerns about the misuse of procurement procedures within the forestry sector. Such practices undermine trust in government institutions and public accountability. Lack of transparency in public spending is a persistent issue that affects citizen confidence. The investigation by ANAP is a crucial step toward addressing these irregularities. Potential action from the courts and competition authorities is expected to follow these findings. Corrective measures will be necessary to restore integrity to the process. This situation underscores the need for stricter oversight of state-owned companies. The government has signaled that such deviations from the law will not be tolerated.

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Meta Patents AI Glasses to Use Facial Recognition to Identify People, Make Highlight Reels of Your Dinner Party

Meta has patented a smart-glasses system that uses facial recognition to create personalized highlight reels of events such as dinner parties. The patent reveals how the system, which includes one or more cameras, would work by using machine-learning and sensory data to detect points of interest in the camera's field of view. Meta has not confirmed whether this feature will be shipped, but the patent provides a detailed look at its exploration of facial recognition and AI-powered memory capture for wearable devices. The system is likely to use user relationship data to personalize highlight files. Meta's smart glasses are the primary focus of the technology, but it remains possible that similar features could be used in other contexts. This development matters as it raises concerns about the potential misuse of facial recognition technology and the impact on user privacy. The patent highlights Meta's ongoing research into AI-powered memory capture and facial recognition for wearable devices. Critics worry about the normalization of surveillance in social settings where consent may be ambiguous. Supporters argue it could enhance how people preserve personal memories automatically. Vulnerability Giving Attackers Full Control of Macs Is Under Active Exploitation

The main event or finding is that a high-severity macOS vulnerability (CVE-2026-65400) is currently under active exploitation, allowing attackers to execute malicious code on systems with exposed port 5900. The vulnerability, which affects macOS Tahoe, Sequoia, and Sonoma, stems from a bug in the screen sharing capability and has been tracked by Ars Technica. Dutch officials have warned of multiple cases where root access was gained and a Monero crypto miner installed on affected systems. Apple released a patch for the vulnerability last week, but its severity rating remains at 7.1 out of 10 due to concerns about potential unauthorized access. The vulnerability is being exploited when port 5900 is exposed to the internet, which can be easily done if screen sharing is enabled without proper configuration. Key individuals and organizations involved include Apple, the Netherlands National Cyber Security Centrum (NCSC), and security researchers at Ars Technica. This matter matters because it highlights the importance of keeping software up-to-date and configuring system settings securely to prevent exploitation. Mac users are advised to block port 5900, use a VPN or SSH tunneling when screen sharing, and keep their systems patched. The active exploitation indicates a heightened risk for unpatched devices in the wild. Security teams are monitoring the situation for further developments and potential variants. Users should verify their firewall settings immediately to mitigate risk. The incident serves as a reminder of the dangers of exposed network services. Enterprise environments are particularly urged to audit their configurations. The crypto mining payload suggests a financial motive behind the attacks. Apple's response time has been noted as relatively quick by industry observers. However, the window of exposure before patching remains a critical vulnerability. Continued vigilance is required until all systems are confirmed secure. The situation underscores the

evolving landscape of macOS security threats.

AI Fails to Deliver a 4-Day Work Week - Especially at AI Companies

The main event or finding is that despite predictions by Google and OpenAI that AI would deliver a four-day workweek by 2025, many tech companies are instead using AI to increase worker productivity without reducing their hours. Labor advocates are calling for stricter oversight on AI deployment in the workplace. The reality of the tech workplace remains intense despite automation promises. Workers report feeling pressured to leverage tools for more output rather than less work. The disconnect between efficiency tools and work-life balance is widening. 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How Larry Ellison Dropped From World's 2nd-Richest To No. 8 In Just 2 Months

This significant drop is largely attributed to a 54% plunge in Oracle's shares since June 1. This has led some to question whether Oracle's spending plans are too aggressive and may weaken its financial position in the short term. As a result, Oracle's market valuation has dropped by \$443 billion since peaking at \$877.1 billion in September. The concerns surrounding Oracle's AI infrastructure business have been echoed by Wall Street analysts, who warn that mega-cap tech firms like Amazon are taking on too much financial risk to match growing demand for AI products. Key people involved include Larry Ellison, the CEO of Oracle, and Jensen Huang, the CEO of Nvidia, who has surpassed Ellison as the richest person in the world. 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Post-Maduro Venezuela Wants Its \$4BN In Gold Back From England

Venezuela's government and opposition are working together to retrieve \$4 billion in gold bullion currently held in the Bank of England's vaults. The move comes after the removal of President Maduro and Caracas' shift towards aligning with US interests, giving them a better chance at accessing their assets. The Bank of England has confirmed its willingness to cooperate, but is demanding clear legal clarity on who holds power in Venezuela before releasing the gold. The funds will be used for post-earthquake reconstruction efforts and to alleviate the effects of years-long US sanctions. A joint statement between the Venezuelan government and opposition was issued, outlining a transparency mechanism to prevent the gold from being misused. President Delcy Rodriguez has personally requested the gold from King Charles, following the devastating twin earthquakes that killed over 6,000 people in Venezuela. The gold's value roughly doubled while it was frozen, and its release could be a significant boon for the country's reconstruction efforts. Investors are increasingly scrutinizing the operational roles of celebrity founders beyond mere endorsement. This lawsuit underscores the risks inherent in early-stage startup financing. The reputation of the involved parties is now at stake alongside the financial losses. Due diligence processes may need to evolve to account for celebrity involvement. 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Rescuers search for survivors of powerful Indonesia earthquake

A magnitude 7.7 earthquake struck the island of Flores in Indonesia on Saturday. The seismic event has killed at least 47 people across the region. Dozens more individuals have been reported injured following the tremors. The quake occurred with a depth of 15km beneath the surface. It was followed by several aftershocks in the immediate aftermath. One of these aftershocks was a second earthquake of magnitude 6.9. The affected areas include Manggarai province specifically. In Manggarai province, 24 fatalities have been recorded so far. Other impacted provinces include East Manggarai and Sikka. Ngada, Ende, and West Manggarai provinces have also been affected. Rescue teams are currently searching for survivors in the debris. Aid packages are being sent to the region to support relief efforts. Indonesia's National Disaster Management Agency is known as the BNPB. The BNPB reported that tremors were felt as far west as Bima Regency. Tremors were also felt in Bima City according to the agency. The disaster is particularly concerning due to the nature of the affected areas. These areas are described as remote and mountainous in terrain. Rescue efforts are ongoing despite the challenging conditions. The full scale of the destruction remains unclear at this time. It will take time to assess the extent of the damage and provide assistance.

Unauthorised sites are growing but travellers say they are forced to break the law

The number of unauthorised Gypsy and traveller sites in England has increased significantly. There has been an increase of 73% since January 2020. A total of 4,950 unpermitted caravans have been identified. The rise in unauthorised development has led to concerns about safety. There are also concerns about planning control and community impact. This has prompted local dismay and legal battles in several areas. Hertfordshire has seen rapid transformations over Bank Holiday weekends. Essex, Cambridgeshire, and Bedfordshire have also seen rapid transformations. The government views unauthorised development as totally unacceptable. Cliff Codona is a traveller rights advocate. Amazon Can Use Your Twitch Content to Train Its AI—Unless You Opt Out

Twitch has officially introduced a new opt-out feature within its account settings dashboard for all users. This tool allows streamers to control whether their content can be used to train Amazon's artificial intelligence models. The move aims to recognize creators' right to decide how their content is used in an evolving digital landscape. However, the change raises significant concerns about how big tech companies handle user data generally. Twitch and Amazon have been using users' content for AI training without explicit consent until now. This previous practice sparked intense debate over the ethics of this specific industry practice. Mary Kish, Twitch's head of community, acknowledged that the change would provoke a negative reaction from users. Meanwhile, Mike Minton noted that other companies may also extract content from Twitch to train their models independently. The controversy highlights the broader "Training Data Problem" facing the industry today. High-quality data for AI training is becoming increasingly scarce and dwindling across the sector. This situation raises serious questions about authorship in the age of generative technology. It also brings transparency and the use of user-generated content in AI development into sharp focus. Over 16,000 creators have expressed opposition to having their content used without consent recently. This opposition has sparked a wider debate over the ethics of AI data collection methods. The update follows changes to Twitch's Terms of Service regarding user permissions. These terms now explicitly state that users grant permission for their content to be used for various purposes. Such purposes now explicitly include AI training under the new policy framework. The move aims to provide creators with more control over their content moving forward. However, its implications for user data and AI development remain unclear to many observers.
