Executive Summary

- **Federal Reserve Holds Rates:** The Fed kept interest rates unchanged as expected, though new "dots" signal a hawkish bias under new chair Kevin Warsh.

Anthropic ships major Claude Design overhaul with design system imports Anthropic has updated Claude Design to address token consumption issues and reposition the tool as an enterprise platform capable of importing design systems from GitHub. The update includes bidirectional integration with Claude Code to bridge the gap between design and engineering workflows. Anthropic becomes first AI startup to join the Frontier carbon removal coalition Anthropic has joined the Frontier carbon removal collective, contributing \$300 million to a new funding tranche that nearly doubles the group's total pledges to \$1.8 billion. This marks the AI startup's first climate-related deal, signaling a shift towards investing in larger-scale sustainable projects alongside companies like Google and Stripe. Microsoft Working To Patch 'RoguePlanet' Zero-Day Microsoft has acknowledged a publicly disclosed vulnerability in its Windows Defender software, CVE-2026-50656, which could lead to privilege escalation via a race condition. Security researcher Nightmare Eclipse released a proof-of-concept exploit, prompting Microsoft to work on a high-quality security update for Windows 10 and 11 users. After unveiling ridiculously expensive AR glasses, Snap's stock takes a dive Snap's stock dropped following the launch of its new augmented reality glasses, Specs, which carry a high price tag of nearly \$2,200. Critics question the profitability of the product given its target demographic of teenagers, despite CEO Evan Spiegel defending the cost by comparing it to high-end computers. The Slate Truck's price may have leaked, starts at \$24,950 Slate Auto's electric pickup truck, The Blank Slate, is set to debut with a starting price of \$24,950, higher than its initial \$20,000 target but still aiming for affordability. The vehicle features a simplified design with optional extras and a less powerful motor than originally planned, though its tow rating has doubled to 2,000 lbs. California says AT&T lied to FCC in attempt to shut off old phone network California regulators have accused AT&T of lying to the FCC about the state's intentions to prohibit the discontinuation of copper phone facilities. While AT&T claims state rules force it to maintain outdated lines, officials argue the state allows upgrades to fiber and is suing to stop AT&T from dropping service to 199,000 customers. He suggested AI could accelerate space exploration and heavy industry relocation, contrasting with warnings from economists about task automation.
