Ukraine Strikes Wildberries Depot Killing Eight

Ukraine launched a significant attack on a Wildberries logistics depot near Moscow, resulting in eight deaths and 62 injuries. The strike caused huge damage to the facilities of the largest Russian online retailer. The Moscow Mayor stated that Ukrainians launched over 370 drones during the incident. A catastrophic fire ensued in the Moscow region following the attack on the warehouses. This event marks a significant escalation in the targeting of Russian economic infrastructure. Wildberries is often referred to as the Russian Amazon due to its market dominance. The attack highlights the widening scope of the conflict beyond traditional military targets. Casualties include both workers and potentially security personnel at the site. Emergency services responded to the blaze but faced challenges due to the scale of the damage. This strike comes amid ongoing tensions and reciprocal attacks between the two nations. The economic impact on Russian logistics networks is expected to be substantial. Investigations are underway to assess the full extent of the

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Hungary Proposes Lowering Voting Age to 16

Australia To Put Environmental Brakes On AI Data Centers

The Australian government has announced plans to regulate large data centers powering artificial intelligence systems. The company stated it had stopped using China-based engineers to support Defense Department cloud systems. The US Defense Department also launched an investigation into potential national security breaches. This finding matters because it highlights the potential for corporate interests to compromise national security. It reveals a lack of transparency in government dealings with contractors. The story sheds light on how reporting led to a policy change. It demonstrates the power of investigative journalism in holding those in power accountable. Federal Employees Can Download TikTok on Work Phones Again

The Department of Justice has announced that federal employees can now download TikTok on their government devices. This reverses a 2022 ban that prohibited the app on official devices. The decision was made due to a deal transferring ownership of TikTok's US operations. A joint venture backed by Oracle, Silver Lake, and MGX now manages the US operations. Oracle serves as the security partner for the new joint venture. ByteDance retains a 19.9% stake in the company. President Donald Trump has cleared federal employees to use TikTok on official devices. This is subject to agency discretion and workplace policies. The reversal was reportedly made after Trump repeatedly delayed the ban. He urged service providers to restore access to the app. The original ban focused on government employees and devices. It had broader implications across the US technology sector. The change allows federal employees to download TikTok following a brief period of unavailability. This development matters as it affects millions of government employees. It may impact workplace policies across various agencies. Next UK Prime Minister Drops Digital ID Scheme
