Executive Summary

- **Romanian Diplomacy & Politics:** The Foreign Ministry confirms a Romanian citizen was sentenced to 15 years in Russia for espionage, while internal political tensions rise as commentator Sever Voinescu criticizes President Nicușor Dan's leadership.
- **Geopolitics:** Israel and Hezbollah have agreed to a ceasefire, though clashes have already stalled the opening round of US-Iran nuclear talks.

Romania

Romanian Citizen Sentenced to 15 Years in Russia for Espionage The Romanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs confirmed that a Romanian citizen has been sentenced to 15 years in prison by Russian authorities for alleged espionage on behalf of Ukraine. Despite diplomatic efforts by the Romanian Embassy in Moscow since December 2024, Russian authorities have refused consular access or communication with the detainee. Israel and Hezbollah Agree to Ceasefire Amid Nuclear Talk Tensions Israel and Hezbollah have agreed to a ceasefire following deadly airstrikes in southern Lebanon, though recent clashes have already stalled the opening round of US-Iran nuclear talks. The interim deal requires an immediate termination of fighting, but Tehran's insistence on linking the ceasefire to broader agreements threatens to complicate diplomatic progress. Unpatchable Exploit Discovered for Older Apple Devices Security researchers have discovered "usbli8er," a new unpatchable BootROM exploit affecting Apple devices with A12 and A13 chips that requires physical USB access to bypass signature checks.
