Amazon Drone Delivery Set to Expand Nationally to Nearly 500 U.S. Cities

Amazon has announced a massive expansion of its Prime Air drone delivery service, targeting nearly 500 cities and towns across the United States by the end of 2026. This rollout marks a sixfold increase in the company's autonomous aerial vehicle footprint and fulfills a promise first made by Jeff Bezos over 13 years ago. The drones are capable of delivering packages weighing up to 5 pounds in as little as 30 minutes after an order is placed. Typical delivery times are expected to range between 60 to 90 minutes depending on location and demand. Initial launch cities include Chicago, Syracuse, Cleveland, Atlanta, and Boise, with many more communities scheduled to follow later this year. Amazon CEO Andy Jassy confirmed that the service will be free for Prime members on orders totaling \$50 or more. Non-Prime

customers will incur a \$4.99 delivery fee for access to the ultrafast drone network. The company emphasized its focus on safety, highlighting an industry-leading Detect-and-Avoid system designed to navigate suburban airspace securely. This expansion comes despite previous regulatory scrutiny and minor incidents involving drone accidents during testing phases. Amazon's move places it in direct competition with other major companies like Walmart and Alphabet's Wing, which are also building extensive drone delivery networks. The technology primarily flies over suburban areas to avoid tall buildings and crowded airspace complexities. Local approvals remain a challenge for the company, particularly regarding noise concerns from residents in delivery zones. This milestone represents a significant step towards mass scale and profitability for Amazon's logistics division. The service currently operates across seven states and has already delivered hundreds of thousands of packages by drone this year. Industry observers note that this expansion marks an exciting milestone in the development of autonomous drone technology for consumer use.

Stripe Acquires AI Model Marketplace OpenRouter for \$7.5 Billion

Stripe has acquired AI model marketplace OpenRouter in a deal valued at approximately \$7.5 billion. Approximately \$1.5 billion of this amount is allocated directly to the founders of the startup. This acquisition marks Stripe's strategic expansion into the infrastructure behind AI applications beyond its traditional payments business. OpenRouter has gained significant popularity among developers seeking free and non-proprietary AI models from various labs. The platform allows access to models from Chinese labs such as DeepSeek and Z.ai alongside Western counterparts. This move highlights the growing importance of open-weight AI models which are often more cost-efficient compared to proprietary models from companies like OpenAI. Stripe CEO Patrick Collison stated that the acquisition will help build a healthy AI ecosystem where multiple models can thrive. The company aims to maximize business profitability through intelligent request routing across different AI models. The deal is seen as part of Stripe's broader effort to establish an economic infrastructure for the artificial intelligence industry. Managing AI costs relative to performance is crucial for developers building scalable applications on these platforms. By acquiring OpenRouter, Stripe is expected to further solidify its position in the rapidly evolving AI landscape. This acquisition matters because it showcases the growing interest in open-source and cost-effective AI solutions among developers. The deal underscores Stripe's commitment to building a sustainable and profitable ecosystem for AI applications. It also signals a shift where payment processors are becoming integral partners in the AI supply chain. Critics note that this consolidates significant power in the AI infrastructure layer within financial tech giants.

Music Publisher Round Hill Files \$1 Billion Copyright Suits Against Suno and Anthropic

Round Hill, an independent music publisher, has filed copyright infringement lawsuits against AI companies Suno and Anthropic. The company claims damages could exceed \$1 billion due to the alleged unauthorized use of hundreds of

copyrighted songs. Round Hill argues that there is nothing fair about building multibillion-dollar AI businesses on copyrighted material while rights holders receive nothing. The publisher's catalog includes iconic songs like the Goo Goo Dolls' Iris and Bonnie Tyler's Total Eclipse of the Heart. Suno and Anthropic are already facing similar lawsuits from music giants Universal Music Group and Sony Music Group. The lawsuit argues that using copyrighted material without permission constitutes a form of theft while the companies reap massive profits. Round Hill has listed 500 songs as infringed upon in the initial filing. There are plans to expand this list to over 10,000 more compositions as the case progresses. This case highlights the growing issue of AI-generated music and its impact on copyright holders in the creative industry. The matter matters because it raises questions about fairness and exploitation in the rapidly evolving tech industry. Legal experts suggest the outcome could set a precedent for how AI models are trained on copyrighted data. Music industry representatives are watching closely to see if this leads to licensing agreements or stricter regulations. The defendants have not yet issued a detailed public response to the specific allegations. This litigation adds to the mounting legal pressure on generative AI companies regarding intellectual property rights. It remains to be seen if this will slow down the development of music generation tools significantly.

Waymo Launches Next-Generation Robotaxi Fleet in Six Major Cities

Waymo has launched its next-generation robotaxi, called the Ojai, to riders in several major cities. The service is now available in Los Angeles, Phoenix, San Francisco, Denver, Las Vegas, and San Diego. The Ojai features a new self-driving system and a redesigned user interface for passengers. It also integrates Google's Gemini AI to enhance the rider experience and vehicle operations. The vehicle is cheaper to build, operate, and maintain than its predecessor according to company statements. Waymo has partnered with Chinese automaker Zeekr to produce the vehicle on Zeekr's SEA-M platform. The company aims to expand its fleet with 5,000 Ojai vehicles by the end of 2026. This plan would more than double its current Jaguar fleet size significantly. This milestone marks a significant step for Waymo as it pushes towards mass scale and profitability. Los Angeles, Phoenix, and San Francisco are among the first cities where riders can use the new robotaxi. Denver, Las Vegas, and San Diego are scheduled to follow later this year. The Ojai's adoption is notable due to its potential to disrupt traditional taxi services and autonomous vehicle technology. Industry analysts view this expansion as a critical test of consumer trust in fully autonomous transport. The lower cost structure may allow Waymo to compete more aggressively with ride-hailing services. Safety records will be closely monitored as the fleet size increases rapidly in urban environments.

Physicists Entangle Quantum Memories Across Record-Breaking 420 Kilometers

Physicists have successfully entangled two quantum memories across 420 kilometers of optical fiber. This achievement sets a new record for the longest distance ever recorded for such an experiment. The research was conducted by a team

led by Xi-Yu Luo at the University of Science and Technology of China in Hefei. This achievement has significant implications for the development of a quantum internet in the future. Such a network could offer unparalleled security and computing power compared to classical systems. The potential benefits of such a system are vast for global communications infrastructure. It enables instantaneous exchanges of information across vast distances without signal degradation. This breakthrough is expected to revolutionize global communication systems eventually. The research was published in Physical Review Letters highlighting the growing advancements in quantum technology. Entanglement across this distance proves the viability of long-range quantum networking nodes. Previous attempts were limited by signal loss over shorter distances in fiber optic cables. Computing power could be distributed across quantum data centers linked by these connections.

US Treasury Doubles Buyback Size as Markets Rally on QE Lite Signals

The US Treasury Department has announced a significant expansion of its bond buyback operations, effectively doubling the size of purchases for longer-dated securities. This unexpected move, described by some market observers as QE Lite, aims to provide greater liquidity support in sectors where demand has been strong. Effective September 9, 2026, the minimum size per operation will rise to \$4 billion, up from the previous \$2 billion cap. The announcement triggered an immediate reaction across global markets, with Treasury yields tumbling and the dollar weakening against major currencies. Gold prices surged in response, holding near \$4,500 an ounce as investors sought alternative assets amidst the shifting landscape. Asian markets also rallied, with bonds and stocks in Japan, Australia, and New Zealand posting gains following the news. Market sentiment suggests a shift towards more accommodative monetary policies, potentially supporting economic growth in the region. Investors had been concerned about rising borrowing costs, but the Treasury's intervention signals a willingness to stabilize the market. The move comes as total US debt approaches historic levels, raising questions about long-term fiscal sustainability. Some analysts view this as a direct attempt to mitigate market volatility without explicit Federal Reserve involvement. Key figures associated with the shift include Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and advisors influenced by traders like Scott Bessent. The strategy addresses liquidity concerns while attempting to manage the yield curve's steepness. Equity futures also rose on the news, indicating broader confidence in the stabilization effort. However, critics worry this blurs the line between fiscal management and quantitative easing. Overall, the intervention marks a pivotal moment in how the US government manages its debt burden. The ripple effects are expected to be felt in currency markets and global interest rates for months to come.

Oil Prices Surge on Fifth Day as Trump Escalates Economic War on Iran

Oil prices have climbed for a fifth consecutive day following heightened geopolitical tensions between the United States and Iran. The global benchmark Brent crude increased towards \$92 a barrel, while West Texas Intermediate rose near \$85. This surge is directly linked to President Donald Trump's announcement of new economic measures aimed at isolating Iran's economy. The package, described as "Economic Warfare and Isolation", intends to crush Iran's economic capabilities through stringent sanctions. Key locations involved include the United States and Iran, with ripple effects

expected across global energy markets. Allies of the US have been urged to stand with Washington against Tehran, complicating international diplomatic efforts. Chinese Consumers Shift to Rentals as Economic Concerns Mount

ChatGPT Citations from Reddit Plummet as AI Sources Shift

OpenAI's ChatGPT has significantly reduced its reliance on Reddit as a source for information in its responses. Data shows that daily citations from the platform plummeted to nearly zero starting from August 8. This drastic change coincides with a shift in the AI model's source selection protocols towards more official outlets. Promptwatch founder Klaas Foppen reported the significant change, noting an 86.4% drop in Reddit's average share of citations. The decrease was swift and has sparked debate about information credibility and algorithmic bias. Concerns about unverified information on Reddit may have played a role in this strategic decision by OpenAI. This matters because it highlights the evolving landscape of AI-driven search platforms and their reliance on credible sources. Critics suggest the move could introduce biases by excluding community-driven content often found on forums. The controversy underscores the tension between open internet data and curated information streams. Tech investors are watching closely to see how this affects user engagement and trust. The change also has implications for how news and opinions are disseminated in the digital age. Reddit's perceived political leanings have been cited as a potential factor in the decision-making process. This shift could impact traffic patterns to social news aggregation sites significantly. Proteste și reacții politice după demiterea primarului Fritz

Hundreds of people took to the streets in Timișoara on Wednesday evening to protest the Constitutional Court decision leading to the dismissal of Mayor Dominic Fritz. The demonstration was organized by civic groups including Alternativa Civică Timișoara and Federația Inițiativa Timișoara to express solidarity with the mayor. Participants gathered in Piața Operei at 19:00 to voice discontent over what they perceive as authoritarian government actions. The controversy stems from changes to the Law on the National Agency for Electoral Integrity (ANI) which resulted in Fritz being denied his mandate. Political figures have weighed in, with Alina Gorghiu suggesting that Nicușor Dan could face suspension if he does not promulgate the ANI law. Meanwhile, Cluj County Council President Alin Tișe launched an ironic call for a protest regarding the financing of the Pediatric Monobloc Hospital in Cluj. Tișe criticized the government for allocating PNRR funds elsewhere while essential healthcare projects remain underfunded. He responded to Fritz's appeal by highlighting that budget allocations are often influenced by political criteria. The protest aims to support both Fritz and essential public services like the children's hospital. Citizens feel their rights and freedoms are being eroded by current political decisions. The situation highlights growing tension between local administration and central government authorities. Organizers promise to continue mobilizing until their demands for judicial and administrative fairness are met. This developing

situation underscores the fragility of local mandates amidst legislative changes. The public response indicates a significant level of civic engagement in western Romania.

ANRE aprobă plata consumatorilor pentru reducerea energiei

The National Authority for Regulation in Energy (ANRE) has approved a new regulation introducing consumption flexibility mechanisms for Romanian energy consumers. This mechanism allows consumers to be paid for temporarily and voluntarily reducing their energy consumption during peak periods. ANRE President George Niculescu emphasized that this is a market-based instrument designed to encourage competition and economic decision-making. The regulation is not intended to restrict consumption but rather to promote voluntary participation from eligible entities. Transelectrica will determine the need for flexibility and organize a tender process to select the most advantageous offers. Eligible participants include consumers, producers, or aggregators who can transmit their offers for reduction capacity and price. The goal is to reduce pressure on the balancing market by allowing voluntary reductions instead of using costly balancing resources. Each MWh of flexibility contracted at a competitive price will displace more expensive resources from the system. This new mechanism transforms consumers into active partners of the National Energy System rather than passive participants. It provides an additional source of supply on the energy market enabling consumers to benefit from selling excess capacity. The initiative aligns with broader European efforts to enhance grid stability and efficiency. Consumers will now have a financial incentive to adjust their usage patterns based on grid needs. This represents a significant shift in how household and industrial energy usage is managed in Romania. The implementation will be monitored to ensure fair compensation and system reliability. Overall, the move is seen as a modernization of the national energy market infrastructure.

The Paks nuclear power plant in Hungary has avoided a complete shutdown thanks to recent engineering works on the Danube River. Premier Peter Magyar announced that the six turbines can resume operation and reach full capacity by Friday of next week. The plant had been operating at only 25% of its capacity due to severe drought conditions affecting water levels. This development highlights the adaptability of nuclear power in extreme climate conditions and boosts Europe's energy production. The Hungarian government constructed a bridge-like structure on the Danube River and sculled two dams nearby to mitigate the drought impact. Magyar confirmed that no further shutdowns are necessary for Hungary's reactors due to these successful adaptations. Romania, also affected by the drought, had previously shut down its last operational reactor due to similar water level concerns. The successful mitigation at Paks serves as a model for other countries facing similar climate challenges. Concerns about energy security have been raised in both Hungary and Romania during this period. The engineering solution involved raising the water level by 15-20 centimeters to ensure sufficient cooling. This intervention prevents a significant loss of electricity generation in the region. The situation

underscores the vulnerability of thermal and nuclear plants to climate change. Both nations are now looking at long-term solutions to prevent future disruptions. The coordination between engineering teams and government officials was critical to this success. Energy markets in the region will stabilize as full capacity returns to the grid. The Romanian government has announced a freeze on salaries and social aids following reports that public debt has exceeded 60% of GDP. This threshold is significant as it breaches the Maastricht criteria for fiscal stability within the European Union. Minister Nazare warned in government meetings that budgetary salaries can no longer be increased under these conditions. The decision aims to restore fiscal discipline and prevent further accumulation of public debt. Economic experts suggest that this measure is necessary to maintain investor confidence in Romanian bonds. Fostul consilier al lui Gorbaciov descrie criza capitalismului oligarhic al lui Putin

Russia's economy is facing its most difficult situation since the 2009 crisis according to economist Abel Aganbegyan. Vaccine breakthrough stops cancer returning in trial

Merck and Moderna have announced a significant breakthrough in cancer treatment with a personalised vaccine. This new development utilizes mRNA technology to target individual patient tumours specifically. The goal is to instruct the immune system to recognise and attack any remaining tumour cells after initial treatment. Scientists achieved this by sequencing the DNA of a small part of a patient's tumour to create a tailored jab. Companies are currently testing similar personalised vaccines for lung, bladder, and kidney cancers alongside melanoma. Stephane Bancel, CEO of Moderna, described the findings as a pivotal moment in cancer research. Experts from Cancer Research UK and the University of Oxford have also weighed in on the development. The development matters because it offers new hope for patients with cancer regarding personalised treatment options. Such treatments could potentially lead to longer and better lives for those affected by the disease. Shares in Moderna and Merck have surged following the public announcement of the trial results. Regulatory bodies will need to assess the data before approving the vaccine for general use. This process ensures that the treatment meets all necessary medical standards. Ultimately, this breakthrough represents a shift towards more precise medicine. It underscores the potential of technology to transform traditional cancer care pathways.

Behaviour guidelines for life in UK published for asylum seekers

The UK Home Office has published a nine-page booklet providing behavioural guidance for asylum seekers. This document outlines laws and customs expected of individuals residing in the country. The booklet covers topics such as respect in public, sex and consent, and gender equality. It aims to educate new arrivals on UK laws to ensure smooth integration and compliance. The Conservative government has stated that those breaking UK law will face consequences. These consequences include deportation and removal from support services. Reform UK claims this

move is a sign of the government's intentions to deport all asylum seekers. According to recent Home Office figures, 93,525 people applied for asylum in the UK between April 2025 and March 2026. This figure represents a decrease of 12% from the previous year. The booklet includes guidance on equal rights for women and the importance of consent in sexual interactions. It also warns against making unwanted comments or engaging in public harassment. The Home Office emphasizes that breaking laws can lead to trouble with the police. Violations may also result in the loss of asylum support or even deportation. This new guide is part of a broader effort by the government to return failed asylum seekers. Nearly 10,000 foreign criminals have been removed since Labour came to power in July 2024. The publication has sparked debate regarding the treatment and expectations of asylum seekers. Critics argue about the timing and necessity of such explicit guidance documents. Supporters believe it clarifies legal obligations for those seeking protection in the UK. The government maintains that understanding local laws is crucial for public safety. This initiative reflects ongoing tensions within the UK immigration system.

Male prisons in England and Wales have fewer than 1,800 spaces

The Ministry of Justice has announced plans to build more prisons while exploring early release options. They are also expanding electronic tagging to manage the offender population. The move comes amid controversy over a planned early release scheme. Prime Minister Andy Burnham is facing pressure from victims' families regarding the policy. Following backlash, Burnham excluded PC Andrew Harper's killers from the scheme. Harper was killed in 2019 while responding to a quad bike theft in Berkshire. The exclusion of certain killers sparked outrage among some political groups. The MoJ has stated that public safety is its top priority in these decisions. Plans include keeping more serious offenders behind bars despite capacity issues. The government also aims to block changes for individuals serving life sentences. Those convicted of severe child abuse will also face stricter retention policies. This move is seen as an effort to address concerns about the prison system's collapse. Male prisons in England and Wales currently have fewer than 1,800 spaces available. The Ministry of Justice has emphasized its commitment to keeping the most serious offenders incarcerated. Burnham had initially expressed a desire to go further in excluding certain individuals from early release. However, he was limited by the need for bipartisan support in parliament. The capacity crisis threatens the ability to sentence new offenders appropriately. Officials are balancing the need for space with the demand for justice. Victims' groups continue to monitor the implementation of release schemes closely. The situation highlights the severe strain on the UK criminal justice infrastructure.

Couple and teenage daughter who died in water off Shoreham named by police

A tragic accident occurred off Shoreham, Sussex, when three members of the same family died. They died while getting into difficulty in the sea during a family outing. The victims were Hassan El-Khawas, 55, and his wife Zeina Alayn, 37. Their 14-year-old daughter Sara El-Khawas also lost her life in the incident. Athletics coach believed missing is in jail for sexual assault

English athletics coach Leon Baptiste has been found serving a prison sentence in Morocco. He was convicted for sexually assaulting a minor in the North African country. Baptiste had been coaching top British track athletes ahead of major competitions. These competitions included the Commonwealth Games and European Championships. He was arrested in May and convicted by the Moroccan judicial authorities. Previously, he was reported missing due to questionable circumstances. Coders Say They Already Found Workarounds to Claude's Invisible Watermarks

Developers within the coding community are claiming to have bypassed the invisible watermarks recently implemented by Anthropic for its Claude AI models. These watermarks were designed to identify AI-generated content and prevent misuse across digital platforms. Early reports suggest that the workarounds involve subtle modifications to the output text that disrupt the watermarking algorithm. This development highlights the ongoing challenge of enforcing digital provenance in the age of advanced generative AI. Security researchers argue that such vulnerabilities were expected given the open nature of software systems. The discovery raises questions about the reliability of current safety measures deployed by major AI laboratories. If widely adopted, these bypasses could undermine efforts to track the origin of synthetic media online. Content platforms may need to update their detection tools to account for these newly discovered loopholes. Anthropic has not yet issued a formal response to the specific claims made by the coding community. Industry experts warn that this cat-and-mouse game between safety engineers and hackers is likely to continue. The situation underscores the difficulty of balancing model accessibility with robust security protocols. Some observers believe this could lead to stricter regulations on how AI models are distributed. Others argue that open scrutiny is necessary to improve the resilience of these safety features. The incident serves as a reminder that no digital watermark is entirely immune to reverse engineering. Future iterations of AI safety tools will need to account for these adversarial techniques. This breach could influence policy discussions regarding AI accountability and transparency. Companies relying on watermarking for copyright protection may need to reassess their strategies. The community response has been mixed, with some praising the transparency and others worrying about misuse. Ultimately, the effectiveness of AI watermarks remains a contentious topic among technologists. This story continues to develop as more technical details emerge from the researcher community.

I Saw the Future of AI in a Robot That Can Learn on the Spot

A recent visit to Generalist AI's office in Cambridge, Massachusetts revealed groundbreaking advancements in robot automation. The robots demonstrated impressive physical intelligence by mastering simple tasks after ingesting instructional videos and no specific training. They showed remarkable adaptability, such as improvising with tools they had not previously seen, like using a dustpan as a brush to pick up blocks. Generalist AI's approach focuses on teaching robots about the physics of the world, inspired by human children's intuitive sense of physics. This method enables robots to transfer learned knowledge to new scenarios, akin to human experimentation and learning. The findings have

significant implications for AI research, particularly in addressing physical intelligence deficits. Companies like Generalist AI are pushing the boundaries of robotics and artificial intelligence. CEO Pete Florence notes that this technology is reminiscent of GPT-3's capabilities, but with added practical applications. This comparison suggests a potential inflection point similar to the rise of large language models. The ability to learn on the spot reduces the need for extensive pre-programming in industrial settings. Such flexibility could revolutionize manufacturing logistics and warehouse automation processes. Observers noted that the robots handled unexpected obstacles with a level of grace uncommon in current systems. The underlying technology relies on advanced computer vision combined with predictive physical modeling. This integration allows the machine to anticipate how objects will move before interacting with them. Safety protocols remain a priority as these more autonomous robots enter shared workspaces. Investors are closely watching Generalist AI to see if this approach scales commercially. The Cambridge team is reportedly expanding its testing to include more complex household tasks. Success in this domain could bridge the gap between digital AI and physical labor. Critics caution that real-world deployment still faces significant hardware reliability hurdles. Nevertheless, the demonstration marks a significant step toward truly generalist robotic agents.

Flock Has a Powerful New AI Tool for Police. We Got Its Code

Flock Safety has unveiled a powerful new AI tool designed specifically for police investigations. The tool aims to enhance law enforcement capabilities through advanced data analysis and surveillance integration. However, a recent report indicates that the code for this system has been obtained by external parties. This leak raises significant concerns regarding the security of proprietary law enforcement technology. Privacy advocates are worried about the potential for misuse if the code falls into the wrong hands.
