Executive Summary

- **Geopolitical Tensions Spike:** Iran has closed the Strait of Hormuz amid accusations against the US and Israel, while Ukraine warns of imminent massive Russian retaliation following drone strikes on Moscow and deep-target refinery attacks.
- **Romania's Strategic Shift:** Bucharest positions itself as a key energy hub via the "Vertical Corridor" project, even as domestic gas production falls and imports rise; politically, Ilie Bolojan stands as the sole candidate for PNL leadership.
- **AI Sector Turbulence:** Nobel laureate John Jumper moves from DeepMind to Anthropic, coinciding with reports that President Trump no longer views the AI firm as a national security threat.

Iran Closes Strait of Hormuz Amidst Rising Regional Tensions Iran has announced the closure of the Strait of Hormuz, accusing the US and Israel of violating a ceasefire, while Revolutionary Guards warn vessels to stay away. Zelenski Warns of Imminent Massive Russian Attack Ukrainian President Volodimir Zelenski has issued a warning that Russia is preparing a massive retaliatory attack on Ukraine following recent drone strikes on the Moscow region. The Ukrainian leader urged citizens to remain vigilant regarding air raid sirens as Russian Foreign Minister Serghei Lavrov previously threatened strikes on military infrastructure. Ukrainian Drones Strike Russian Refinery 1,200 Miles from Frontline In a significant escalation, Ukraine launched a drone attack on an oil refinery in Russia's Tyumen region, located approximately 2,000 kilometers from the front line. Romania Becomes Key Node in New European Energy Corridor The "Vertical Corridor" initiative aims to reduce European dependence on Russian gas by connecting infrastructure across Bulgaria, Romania, Hungary, and Ukraine, with Greece serving as a hub. Romania is expected to benefit from investments up to €1.648 billion to develop transport systems, with the project estimated to cost €800 million overall by 2029. Source: [Antena 3](#)

Ilie Bolojan Confirmed as Sole Candidate for PNL Leadership Ilie Bolojan is the only candidate for the presidency of the National Liberal Party (PNL) ahead of the congress scheduled for June 21, proposing Dan Motreanu and Robert Sighiartău for key roles. Meanwhile, current leader Ciprian Ciucu is withdrawing from leadership, while newcomers Oana Gheorghiu and Dragoș Pîslaru have joined the party to run for congress positions. Nobel Laureate John Jumper Leaves DeepMind for Anthropic John Jumper, a recent Nobel Prize winner in chemistry, is departing Google DeepMind after nine years to join rival AI firm Anthropic.
