Apple and Microsoft Hike Prices Amid Memory Crunch

Apple has raised prices on Macs and iPads by up to 25% due to a global memory chip shortage driven by AI data center demand, while Microsoft also increased Xbox console prices. Wall Street reacted negatively to the move, with shares dropping significantly as analysts warn of further inflationary pressure on consumer electronics.

Trump Admin Delays OpenAI Model Release Over Security

The Trump administration has requested OpenAI delay the release of GPT-5.6 due to security concerns raised by the Office of the National Cyber Director. OpenAI will initially offer the model to a small group of partners with government approval required during the preview period to mitigate potential threats.

Anthropic Accuses Alibaba of Massive AI Cloning Attack

Anthropic has accused Alibaba of launching over 28.8 million exchanges to clone its leading AI model, Claude, using fraudulent accounts and obfuscation techniques. The company warns that without stronger interventions, China could reach comparable AI capabilities sooner and is urging Congress to update antitrust laws.

Polestar Banned From Selling Cars In US From Model Year 2027

The US Department of Commerce has denied Polestar authorization under the Connected Vehicle Rule, preventing the company from selling new 2027 models in the US due to national security concerns. Polestar will continue to sell existing inventory but will shift focus to other markets as it exits the US.

Devastating Earthquakes Strike Venezuela

Two powerful earthquakes with magnitudes of 7.2 and 7.5 hit Venezuela, causing widespread destruction in Caracas and leaving hundreds dead. The Colombian government reported the quake was felt in Bogota, while Venezuelan officials ordered gas suspensions and declared a state of urgency.
