Romanian Government Negotiations Collapse Amidst Conflicting Demands

Negotiations for forming a new government in Romania have failed to reach an agreement between major parties at Cotroceni. AUR leader George Simion stated the only solution is AUR joining the government, while PNL announced it will not vote for Sorin Grindeanu. USR ministers proposed a rotation government, highlighting the challenges of coalition-building and potential consequences for democratic governance.

Romania Faces Record-Breaking June Heatwave with Temperatures Up to 40°C

Romania is facing its worst heatwave in recent years, with temperatures expected to reach up to 40°C in some areas. Europe's Deadly Heatwave Breaks German Record and Halts Public Events
