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Firefighters Battle Massive Wildfires as Hundreds of Thousands Evacuated

Firefighters are currently battling intense wildfires near Bordeaux as tens of thousands of residents are evacuated. Authorities in France have ordered the largest peacetime evacuation since World War II due to the raging fires. Over 300,000 people have fled from the path of the wildfires across France and Spain. The city of Bordeaux faces the possibility of a complete evacuation if conditions worsen. Violent wildfires are raging close to major French and Spanish cities causing widespread disruption. Officials report that France recorded 5,000 excess deaths during the ongoing heat wave. Smoke from the fires is impacting air quality across Europe and North America. Berlin Pride Attack Suspect Shot and Killed by Police

Police have shot and killed the suspect involved in the Berlin Pride ramming attack. The incident occurred during a parade celebrating the LGBTQ community in the German capital.
