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Administration Admits Canceling Federal Grants For Purely Political Reasons

The US Department of Energy has officially acknowledged that it canceled over \$7.5 billion in Biden-era federal grants for clean energy projects. This decision was based solely on political criteria, specifically targeting states represented by Democrats and those that voted for Kamala Harris in the 2024 election. The grants were awarded to projects in Blue States and were terminated as part of a government-wide effort to punish Democratic-led states. Key individuals involved include President Biden and his administration, particularly Russell Vought, Secretary of Energy under the Trump administration who is now at the helm of the department. Organizations affected include the Department of Energy, the US government, and various states that voted for or against Kamala Harris. This admission matters because it highlights the administration's partisan approach to federal funding. It potentially deprives Democratic-led states of critical resources

and undermines the integrity of the electoral process. The DOE's statement is seen as a candid acknowledgment of its actions being motivated by politics rather than public interest. Critics argue this move sets a dangerous precedent for future federal funding allocations. The cancellation impacts numerous clean energy initiatives that were already in development. Trump Admin Exempts SpaceX Starlink From FCC Ban On Foreign-Made Routers

The US Department of War has granted a significant exemption to SpaceX's Starlink routers from the Federal Communications Commission ban on foreign-made routers. The FCC had previously updated its rules to include all consumer-grade routers made outside the US, except those with specific exemptions. This move is seen as a major development in the ongoing debate over national security risks posed by foreign networking products. SpaceX's exemption will last until February 1, 2028, allowing them to continue using existing supply chains. Other major vendors such as Netgear and Amazon have previously been granted similar exemptions. The FCC has stated that foreign-made routers pose an unacceptable risk to national security, leading to calls for companies to manufacture more devices in the US. As a result, it is expected that companies with Chinese ties will struggle to obtain exemptions from the Trump administration. SpaceX's exemption is notable as other Starlink routers are made in Vietnam, sparking debate over the company's commitment to US manufacturing. This decision matters because it sets a precedent for how the FCC will handle foreign-made networking products. It has significant implications for the tech industry's global supply chain. Xbox Outage Blocks Physical Disc Games

Xbox experienced an extended outage on Sunday evening, affecting not only digital game play but also disc-based games. The issue began at around 11PM ET and lasted for several hours, causing users to be unable to launch apps, find games on the Xbox store, or log in. The outage was confirmed by Xbox's status page, which initially reported problems with both digital and disc games. However, after a prolonged period of downtime, Xbox announced that the issues had been mitigated at 6:48PM ET. Users were able to launch their own digital games, but those tied to Game Pass experienced error codes. This outage highlights the potential risks of a system that ties authentication requirements to physical game copies. Xbox has recently undergone major layoffs, and this incident may shed light on the company's decision-making processes. The issue was resolved after several hours of downtime, with Xbox confirming all services are now up and running. Consumers are increasingly concerned about reliance on online servers for physical media. The incident has sparked discussions about consumer rights and ownership in the digital age. Xbox support teams were overwhelmed during the peak of the outage. This event serves as a reminder of the fragility of modern gaming infrastructure.

China Begins Mass Production Of Homegrown DUV Chip Tools

China has begun mass-producing its first homegrown immersion DUV lithography machines, marking a significant milestone for its semiconductor industry. An estimated five units are expected this year for companies such as SMIC and Hua Hong. The production is being led by Shanghai Yuliangsheng Technology, a state-backed startup. While the technology is significant, it still lags behind ASML's tools in terms of performance and build quality. China aims to reduce its dependence on foreign components, with domestic components making up most of the new systems. However, delays at local suppliers have held back output this year. The move matters as it represents a major step forward for China's semiconductor industry, which is expected to become increasingly important globally. The development also highlights China's efforts to reduce its reliance on ASML, a Dutch company that dominates the immersion lithography market. Qualifying the new machines for production lines could take months, and they will likely face significant competition from established players. This shift could alter the global balance of chip manufacturing power. Western sanctions have accelerated China's push for self-sufficiency. The success of these tools will be closely watched by international observers.

Codeberg Bans Cryptocurrency And LLM-Generated Code Projects

Codeberg, a community-led open source project hosting site, has announced that it will no longer allow projects whose code is largely or fully machine-generated through Large Language Models and other AI tools. The decision was made after a successful community vote, which saw 358 votes in favor and 144 against the motion to disallow such projects. This move follows a similar ban on cryptocurrency-related projects implemented by the platform. Codeberg cited concerns over license whitewashing and the indirect hardware costs associated with hosting AI datacenter hyperscaling. The decision aims to protect the Open Source Software community from what it sees as destructive tools that are externalizing costs onto the platform. The move is also seen as a response to studies that suggest LLM-based tools are damaging the OSS community. Codeberg's leadership has expressed concerns over the impact of these AI tools on the platform and its users. The ban is effective immediately, and users will be notified about projects that no longer meet the new criteria. This decision highlights the growing tension between the benefits and drawbacks of using LLMs in open source development. It reflects a broader debate about the ethics of AI in software creation. Developers are divided on whether this protects or hinders innovation.

YouTube Premium Will Include Peacock Starting Next Year

YouTube Premium subscribers are set to gain access to Peacock's ad-supported content starting in 2027. The partnership between NBCUniversal and YouTube will allow users to stream Peacock shows, movies, and live sports directly through the YouTube app at no additional cost. The deal marks a significant expansion of Peacock's reach, as it aims to boost its growth by reaching millions of existing YouTube Premium subscribers. The agreement comes amid a major reorganization for Peacock, which is separating from Comcast's broadband business alongside NBCUniversal and Sky. Matt Strauss, chairman of NBCUniversal's media group, sees the partnership as key to Peacock's next phase of growth. With 125 million Premium and Music subscribers and 48 million US-based Peacock subscribers, this deal could be a game-changer for both platforms. The partnership also includes live sporting events and an extension of YouTube TV's distribution agreement with NBCUniversal. This development matters as it will provide users with more content options and potentially increase viewership for both services. As Peacock turns a profit, this move strengthens its position in the streaming market. It signals a trend towards bundling services to retain subscribers. Competition in the streaming wars continues to intensify.

Apple Sued After Alleged App Store Crypto Scam Cost Users \$1.8M

A lawsuit has been filed against Apple alleging negligence over its App Store security measures. Three plaintiffs claim they lost a combined \$2 million after downloading and installing a fraudulent crypto wallet app, despite being warned about it by the creator, Craig Raw. The lawsuit challenges Apple's claim that its App Store is safer than competitors' platforms due to its strict control over approved apps. The plaintiffs argue that Apple knowingly hosted the fake app, contradicting its own guidelines against such behavior. They are seeking a trial by jury and damages, as well as warnings and disclosures about the risks of using the App Store. Key individuals involved include Craig Raw, creator of Sparrow Bitcoin Wallet, and the three plaintiffs. The lawsuit matters because it questions Apple's control over its App Store and whether it is truly secure for users. It also highlights the ongoing debate about app store security and regulation. If successful, this could force Apple to change its vetting processes. Consumers are increasingly wary of financial apps on mobile platforms. The case underscores the risks of centralized app distribution models.

BlackRock Says Crypto Can Outrun The Quantum Threat

BlackRock, the world's largest asset manager, has expressed optimism about upgrading existing cryptography to quantum-resistant standards for cryptocurrencies like Bitcoin. The report notes that this task is technically easier than building a functional quantum computer capable of breaking that cryptography. BlackRock manages over \$15 trillion in assets and has significant skin in the game with its newly launched Bitcoin and Ethereum exchange-traded funds. The company's CEO, Larry Fink, has previously described Bitcoin as digital gold and an international asset. However, the report highlights that coordination and implementation are the key challenges in upgrading Bitcoin's cryptography. Approximately 35% of circulating Bitcoin's supply is potentially vulnerable to certain attack types due to exposed public keys. BlackRock announced a new Bitcoin Security Consortium aimed at supporting proposals like BIP-360, which it

considers a credible solution. The report concludes that while building a quantum computer capable of breaking cryptocurrency cryptography remains daunting, upgrading existing systems is a more feasible task. This finding matters because it highlights the advantages of defense over offense in the crypto-quantum debate. It underscores the importance of timely coordination and implementation. Investors are watching closely for signs of protocol upgrades.

Romania Expels Russian Diplomat After Drone Incursions

Romania has summoned the Russian Ambassador, Vladimir Lipaev, in response to repeated airspace incursions by Russian drones over the past few days. Representatives from the Romanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs presented evidence of the drones' Russian origin and protested the incidents as illegal and irresponsible actions. The MAE declared that Russia bears full responsibility for violating Romania's airspace and deteriorating regional security. This incident also affects NATO and EU airspace, highlighting Romania's sovereignty in the region. As a result, Romania has issued an official protest note to Russia and declared one of the Russian diplomats at the Romanian embassy as *persona non grata*, forcing him to leave the country within five days. In response, Romania has called upon its NATO allies for assistance in protecting national security. Russian drones have been spotted entering Romania's airspace in broad daylight for the first time, sparking concern among Romanian authorities and NATO. The incident marks a significant escalation in tensions between Russia and Romania. The drones involved are believed to be Iranian-made Shahed drones, which have a range of up to 2,500 km. President Nicusor Dan has sent officials to Washington for meetings with the Trump Administration to promote alignment on security issues. Poland has issued a message of support for Romania following the incursions. Moscow has warned Bucharest that it will receive an adequate response to the expulsion. 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France And Spain Wildfire Witnesses Describe Wall Of Flames

France has experienced its worst wildfire season on record, with over 116,000 hectares of land burned and 250,000 people evacuated since mid-July. The affected areas are located in the Gironde and Landes regions of southwest France. Record-breaking heat waves across Europe and prolonged drought conditions have contributed to the severity of the damage. 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English Football Agrees Trial To End Goalkeeper Tactical Timeouts

The Football Association, Premier League, English Football League, National League, and Women's Super League have agreed to implement a trial to eradicate the goalkeeper tactical timeout. The measure, led by Pro Ref, involves removing an outfield player from the pitch if a referee signals for the physio to treat the goalkeeper. If no player is selected within 10 seconds, the captain must leave the field. This trial aims to reduce controversy and disruption caused by goalkeepers taking tactical timeouts during games. The first game featuring this trial will be the Carabao Cup preliminary round tie between Tranmere and Rochdale on Saturday. Similar trials are also being explored in the Australian A-League. Goalkeeper treatment has become increasingly common, often disrupting opposition momentum. Private Claude Chats Exposed In Google And Bing Search Results

Some Anthropic Claude chat conversations were inadvertently indexed by major search engines like Google and Bing, potentially compromising user privacy. The chats included personal questions, such as political party affiliations and ethical violations, as well as explicit content. Anthropic, the company behind Claude, had instructed web crawlers not to index these chats via a robots.txt file, but some results still appeared in search engine results due to technical limitations. Google and Bing claim that they respect website owners' directives, including robots.txt instructions, but may still index pages linked to from other websites. Anthropic did not respond to questions about the issue or why it didn't include the

noindex tag on its shared chat pages. This incident raises concerns about the potential for generative AI to compromise user privacy and the limitations of website owners' control over search engine indexing. It also highlights the need for more robust measures to protect sensitive information from being indexed by search engines. The issue has sparked renewed debate about the use of robots.txt files and their effectiveness in preventing search engine indexing. As a result, users may want to exercise caution when sharing personal conversations on AI chatbots like Claude. This breach underscores the complexities of managing public-facing AI interfaces. Companies must balance accessibility with security.

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Ilya Sutskever's Safe Superintelligence Partners With Nvidia To Scale Its AI Research

Safe Superintelligence, an AI lab founded by former OpenAI co-founder Ilya Sutskever, has announced a long-term partnership with Nvidia that will give it access to the Vera Rubin GPU platform. This deal increases its compute resources by an order of magnitude.
