Lilian Weng flips from Thinking Machines to OpenAI after saying the startup's pace hurt her health

The main event is that Lilian Weng, co-founder of AI startup Thinking Machines Lab, is rejoining OpenAI as part of the company's efforts to develop AI that can improve itself. Weng had previously stepped down from Thinking Machines Lab due to burnout and will now lead a team focused on accelerating internal research at OpenAI. The researcher has returned to OpenAI after working at various other companies, including Facebook, Dropbox, and Affirm, and previously worked on developing the company's GPT-4 model. Weng's return to OpenAI matters because it highlights the company's commitment to advanced AI research and its efforts to develop recursive self-improvement capabilities. The move also marks a significant departure for Thinking Machines Lab, which has lost nearly all of its original founding members since its launch. Weng's rejoining OpenAI underscores the trend of top researchers and engineers returning to

companies like OpenAI after leaving startups due to burnout or other challenges. The shift is likely driven by the growing importance of AI research and development in various industries. Judge: DOJ Undid Its Attempt To Bully Portland Police Because AG Harmeet Dhillon Tweeted Thru It

The US Department of Justice (DOJ) has lost its attempt to bully the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) after a federal judge rejected their demand for thousands of documents. The DOJ had cited a 2013 settlement to justify the request, but Judge Michael Simon found that the government's intentions were impure and that they were using unclean hands. The settlement was actually related to excessive force against people with mental health issues, not speech suppression. Assistant Attorney General Harmeet Dhillon's tweet about conducting an investigation into PPB policing was also deemed unprofessional and threatening. The DOJ had initially sought the documents as part of a broader effort to punish PPB for anti-ICE protests in Portland, Oregon. The case highlights the hypocrisy of the Trump administration, which has been accused of targeting liberal cities like Portland. The ruling is a blow to the DOJ's credibility and could make it harder for them to secure victories in the future. Key individuals involved include Harmeet Dhillon and Nick Sortor, who was arrested by PPB last October. The case matters because it shows the administration's willingness to use coercive tactics to achieve its goals. Rather than engaging in good-faith investigation and collaboration, the DOJ pursued a political agenda. This legal defeat may constrain future federal interventions in local policing matters. Civil liberties groups are celebrating the decision as a win for local autonomy. The judge's strong language indicates judicial pushback against federal overreach. Public trust in the DOJ may be further eroded by this incident. The Portland Police Bureau can now operate with less federal interference. Trump Administration Bans New Chinese Humanoid Robots

The Trump administration has banned newly authorized foreign-made humanoid and four-legged robots, as well as power inverters, due to unacceptable risks to national security. The ban was implemented by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), with FCC chairman Brendan Carr citing concerns over data theft, surveillance, and cyberattacks. The FCC added the items to its Covered List, a register of goods deemed a risk to US national security. The ban applies only to new foreign-produced advanced robotic devices and power inverters, not existing models previously authorized by the FCC. Foreign-made robots and power inverters could allegedly be used for surveillance, hacking, or remote control by foreign government actors. This move aims to secure America's critical supply chains against potential espionage. The ban is seen as a significant step to protect US national security from potential threats. However, it may also impact innovation and trade with other countries significantly. The decision is likely to have implications for industries relying on foreign-made robotic devices and power inverters. The Federal Communications Commission has issued a ban on foreign-made robots weighing over 4.4 pounds. This will only apply to new models produced by countries including Japan, South Korea, and Germany. The ban matters because it restricts the purchase of new, foreign-made robots, but allows for the continued use of existing models. Exemptions apply to certain types of robots, such as those used in trains, drones, underwater vehicles, medical robots, and industrial robot arms. The ban is seen as a potential boost to US manufacturing and innovation. Some companies are already establishing production facilities in the country to comply. Notable organizations include the FCC, US Department of Defense, and companies such as Agility Robotics. This policy shift reflects broader tensions in global technology trade. Critics argue it may slow down adoption of beneficial automation technologies. Supporters claim it is necessary to prevent foreign adversarial influence. The long-term economic impact remains to be seen by market analysts.

Microsoft confirms Copilot 'super app' coming this year

More Than 30 Minnesota Water Systems Targeted In Cyberattack

Seceta declanșează una dintre cele mai mari crize din energia României și scoate din funcțiune în totalitate centrala de la Cernavodă, responsabilă pentru 20% din producție

The main event or finding is that Romania's nuclear power plant at Cernavodă has announced a controlled shutdown and disconnection from the national grid, effective July 29 or 30. This decision was made due to a decline in the Danube River's level, which is similar to a situation experienced by the Unitatea 1 plant two days ago. Nuclearelectrica, the only nuclear power producer in Romania, has taken this measure as a precautionary measure to protect nuclear safety. The shutdowns are planned in accordance with standard procedures for severe drought situations. Experts at the Cernavodă Nuclear Power Plant have applied operational measures to maintain safe margins. This is the first time that both units operated by Nuclearelectrica are being shut down simultaneously. The decision has been made in light of forecasted parameters that approach admitted operating limits for the Danube River. Nuclearelectrica emphasized that these measures were taken to ensure nuclear safety and standard operating procedures. The drought has triggered one of the biggest crises in Romania's energy sector. The plant is responsible for 20 percent of the country's energy production. This loss of capacity will likely lead to higher energy prices for consumers. Officials are urging the population to reduce consumption during peak hours. Importation of energy from neighboring countries may be required to fill the gap. The situation highlights the vulnerability of nuclear infrastructure to climate change. Water levels in the Danube are at unprecedented lows this summer. Probleme cu incendiile și în Creta, una dintre cele mai căutate destinații din Grecia: Doi pompieri au murit. Localități evacuate

Two Greek firefighters have died in a fire on the island of Crete, where the blaze forced the evacuation of several towns. The deceased were found dead in their vehicle near Nea Krya Vrysi in Rethymno. A third firefighter died in an incident near Gytheio in the Peloponez region of southern Greece. The fire broke out around lunchtime and spread rapidly, prompting multiple emergency alerts. Locals from Krya Vrysi, Saktouria, and Melampes were ordered to evacuate due to

the threat from flames. Over 125 firefighters, including six specialized teams, were deployed to combat the blaze. Four aircraft and four helicopters also assisted in the operation significantly. The Greek Firefighting Department has launched an investigation into the cause of the fire. This incident is part of a larger pattern of wildfires in Greece each summer due to heatwaves. Droughts and canicule conditions are exacerbating the fire risk across the region. Romanian tourists are advised to exercise caution when traveling to affected areas. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has issued a travel warning for specific regions. Evacuation orders were issued for six localities in Crete alone. The fires have damaged property and threatened historical sites. International assistance may be requested if the situation worsens. Climate experts warn that such events will become more frequent. The tourism industry faces potential disruptions during the peak season. Local authorities are working around the clock to contain the spread. Public safety remains the top priority for emergency responders. This tragedy highlights the dangers faced by frontline firefighting personnel.

BBC cancels Blankety Blank, Celebrity Mastermind and Live at the Apollo due to budget cuts

The BBC has announced that it will be cancelling Celebrity Mastermind, Live at the Apollo, and Blankety Blank due to financial savings. The main Mastermind series will continue with Clive Myrie as host for the foreseeable future. The celebrity spin-off show, Blankety Blank, was filmed after its cancellation and will end after its upcoming series. The decision was made in light of declining viewing figures for all three shows significantly. Viewing numbers have dropped significantly over the years, from 4 million to 1.7 million for Celebrity Mastermind. Blankety Blank saw a drop from 5.5 million to 2.3 million viewers over the same period. Live at the Apollo dropped from 1.3 million to 660,000 viewers recently. The BBC cited its funding challenges as the reason for the cuts explicitly. Despite this, the corporation expressed pride in all three shows and thanked their production teams. This decision highlights the impact of declining TV ratings on UK entertainment programming. Budget constraints are forcing difficult choices across the broadcaster's portfolio. Staff involved in the productions face uncertainty about their future employment. Audiences have expressed disappointment on social media platforms. The moves are part of a broader strategy to streamline operations. Digital platforms may offer alternative homes for some content. The BBC aims to focus resources on higher-performing genres. The Chinese robot army transforming the UK's retail industry

The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) has highlighted the UK's need to adopt robotics and automation technologies to improve productivity growth. The OECD notes that despite the UK's manufacturing heritage, it lags behind in robotics adoption significantly. Companies like Geek+ and MotionTech are already benefiting from robotics implementation in their warehouses. Britain's large e-commerce and logistics sector presents a significant

How the UK's extreme heat is shifting the conversation about air-con

The main event or finding is that Britain's approach to air conditioning has become politicized, with some councils prioritizing low-energy cooling methods. Others are pushing for widespread use of air conditioning across public buildings. Key people involved include David Lawrence of the Centre for British Progress think tank.
