GCC Adopts Policy Rejecting Significant AI-Generated Code

The Gulf Cooperation Council has officially adopted a new policy regarding software contributions. This policy explicitly rejects substantial code contributions generated by large language models. The rule applies to direct copies of AI output as well as edited versions. It targets any code that is still based on system-generated material. This move aims to address growing concerns over AI tools in open-source development. Key organizations involved include the GCC and news outlet Linuxiac. The policy provides exceptions for trivial and legally insignificant changes. However, contributors must disclose their use of the tool in all cases. Test cases can still be accepted if they involve small programs for bug reproduction. This decision sets a major precedent for how open-source projects handle AI code. It potentially affects the broader software development community significantly. The move highlights the debate over the role of AI in coding. There is a clear need for guidelines on intellectual property and collaboration. The GCC stance may influence other organizations to adopt similar policies. This could shape the future of open-source software development globally.

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Catastrophic MoD Data Breach Caused By Lack of Training On Excel

A UK parliamentary inquiry has revealed the cause of a catastrophic Ministry of Defense data breach. The breach exposed the details of 18,700 Afghans who were at risk from the Taliban. The inquiry found this could have been prevented with basic Excel training. The incident occurred in February 2022 and compromised individuals linked to UK forces. Key people involved include unnamed MoD employees and government officials. Organizations involved are the Ministry of Defense and the UK Parliament. This matter highlights a failure of accountability within the civil service. There is a clear need for greater transparency and democratic oversight. The breach led to an unprecedented superinjunction against national media. It also prompted a secret evacuation program for those at risk. Despite this, thousands of Afghans eligible for Britain remain trapped. The government has yet to provide clear explanations on helping them. MPs have called for periodic reassessments of the risks facing applicants. Ministers must publish a clear policy on helping those not evacuated. This story matters because it shows the human cost of administrative failure.

Investors Love AI, As Long As You're a Cloud Host

Amazon has reported better-than-expected second-quarter earnings recently. Net sales rose 20 percent while cloud revenue showed significant growth. The company's spending on data centers increased by 60 percent to 173 billion dollars. This occurred despite conventional wisdom that investors want reduced infrastructure investments. Amazon's strong revenue engine from AWS business justified the high spending. The AWS business rose 37 percent in the reported period. However, Amazon is dipping into its cash reserves significantly. The company has now experienced negative free cash flow for the first time this year. Its AI play involves long-term bets on chips like Trainium TPU. These investments can improve margins for its cloud business eventually. This trend is seen in other companies such as Microsoft and Google. Shares have risen after reporting strong cloud revenue in those cases. Investors remain skeptical about the underlying economics of AI labs. There is a need for sustained demand to justify high spending on infrastructure. Amazon's hosting revenue is closely tied to the growth of the AI industry.

ABC Demands FCC Drop Its Punitive Early License Renewal

ABC has formally opposed the FCC effort to force early license renewal. The company claims this is an attempt to chill free speech significantly. ABC alleges that the FCC motivations are clear to observers. They believe it is to punish ABC for airing content disfavored by the Trump administration. The FCC had ordered ABC to file for early license renewal in

April. They cited potential law violations and compliance with public interest obligations. The move has sparked an outpouring of support from viewers. Over 153,000 comments were filed on the FCC docket recently. Key figures involved include ABC executives and FCC Chair Brendan Carr. Critics have accused Carr of using his position to punish speech. This includes some Republicans who disagree with the administration views. The issue has sparked a debate about the role of free press. It questions the limits of government over media companies. The FCC did not respond to requests for comment on the matter. This development matters because it highlights concerns about government overreach. It shows the chilling effect it can have on free speech in media.

Cisco Just Fingerprinted Almost 900 Open Models for Free

Cisco has launched the AI Supply Chain Provenance Explorer publicly. This is a free public database that provides information on open models. It covers models hosted on Hugging Face primarily. The explorer aims to address verification gaps in the AI supply chain. It provides a single source of truth for model lineage and licensing. As of February 2026, Alibaba Qwen family is the declared parent of 69 percent of derivatives. Chinese labs account for 70 percent of these new open-model derivatives. This matters because it highlights the need for transparency in AI development. The explorer uses static fingerprinting and behavioral-similarity analysis. It grounds the lineage graph and provides real-time data on performance. Cisco Model Provenance Kit is being updated with this new tool. This enables enterprises to better understand their models and mitigate risks. The launch comes ahead of the European Commission AI Act enforcement powers. These powers will regulate open-source models in the EU market starting August 2. This move aims to promote a more transparent and secure AI supply chain.

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LinkedIn Actually Adds a Seems Like AI Slop Button

LinkedIn has introduced a new feature allowing users to flag posts. Users can now mark content as seemingly AI slop explicitly. This aims to reduce the volume of apparent artificial intelligence-generated content. The move is part of the company broader efforts to address AI content. 41 percent of longform LinkedIn posts are already flagged as completely generated by AI. Chief product officer Hari Srinivasan stated AI slop is a top priority. They care about this issue deeply according to company statements. The new feature will be available in the three-dots menu on posts. It will help LinkedIn tune their models and make better feeds. Additionally, LinkedIn is testing a way to show users when others perceive content as inauthentic. The company is also removing an AI-powered feature that enhanced posts. This update aims to improve the overall quality of content on LinkedIn. By addressing AI-generated content, LinkedIn hopes to provide a more authentic experience. Apple Stockpiles Inventory As It Braces for Significant Supply Constraints

Apple and other hardware makers are facing significant challenges currently. High demand for memory components is affecting production of iPhones and MacBooks. This phenomenon is known as RAMageddon by industry observers. The company outgoing CEO Tim Cook described this as a hundred-year flood on pricing. Despite strong earnings in its recent June quarter, Apple is bracing for shortages. Supply shortages are expected to worsen in the coming months. Key people involved include Tim Cook and John Ternus who takes over in September. Organizations such as Meta, Samsung, Microsoft, and Sony face similar challenges. The issue matters because it highlights strain on global supply chains. This is due to growing demand for generative AI-related hardware components. Hungary Stops Paks Nuclear Plant Due to Danube Drought

The Hungarian nuclear power plant at Paks will be shut down completely soon. This is due to low water levels in the Danube River significantly. Hungarian Prime Minister Peter Magyar announced this decision publicly. He cited record-low water levels as the reason for the shutdown. The plant has four Russian-built reactors with a capacity of 2 gigawatts. It has already reduced production and operates at only 50 percent capacity. Low water levels have also affected transport and river traffic. Magyar assured that Hungary power grid can handle imported energy. The Premier warned of potential energy crisis if no measures are taken. A state of emergency plan is set to be unveiled on Wednesday. It will include a list of key consumers including industrial companies. Their energy consumption may need to be limited temporarily. The situation highlights the impact of drought on Hungary energy infrastructure. Romania is also experiencing severe drought with the Danube flowing lower. 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MApN Announces Drone Alert in Tulcea

Romania air defense system has detected multiple drones along its border. Two F-16 fighter jets were raised to intercept them immediately. The drones entered Romania airspace after being tracked by radar. They are believed to be of Russian origin by officials. The Romanian military issued an RO-Alert warning the public of possible object drops. NATO has confirmed that it is monitoring the situation closely. It has raised its alert level in response to the incident. The incident occurred amid a recent escalation of attacks near Romania border. Ukraine is at war with Russia currently. This is not the first time drones have been detected along this border. Three more were detected last week in similar circumstances. NATO has praised Romania for its defense efforts including interception. Successful interception of drones used F-16 fighter jets. Rheinmetall in Discussions for Mangalia Shipyard Acquisition

German defense giant Rheinmetall is in advanced discussions to acquire a shipyard. The target is Romania Damen Shipyards shipyard in Mangalia. This is a major naval construction site in the region. Thousands Evacuated in Crete Due to Wildfires

A massive wildfire broke out on the Greek island of Crete recently. It is affecting several regions, particularly Rethymno significantly. The fire is spreading rapidly due to strong winds. Egypt Attacked by Drones as Iran War Extends

Two ships in the Egyptian port of Damietta were set on fire recently. An unmanned aerial vehicle drone allegedly caused this deliberately. The Egyptian authorities claim that the incident was caused by a drone. No one has claimed responsibility for it yet. If confirmed, this would be the first time Egypt is directly targeted. 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Amendment Leaves Dominic Fritz Without Mayor Mandate

Incredible Images of Dried Danube Published by Apele Romane

Romania is experiencing severe drought currently. The Danube River is flowing at a mere 1,600 cubic meters per second. This is nearly three times lower than its normal average. The situation is particularly dire for the region agriculture and energy sectors. Reduced water flows are affecting irrigation systems significantly. They are threatening to disrupt power generation capabilities. The Romanian authorities have been closely monitoring the drought. Experts from INHIDRO predict further declines in water levels. This has led to restrictions on agricultural activities. Regions such as Crişana and Oltenia are experiencing reduced flows. Some sections of rivers are experiencing complete drying up. Archbishop of Canterbury Committed to 100m Slavery Fund

UEFA to Boycott World Cups If FIFA Plans Approved

Andy Burnham to Give Regional Mayors Share of Income Tax

Carvana Crashes After Earnings Outlook Disappoints Wall Street

Carvana full-year earnings guidance may fall short of Wall Street expectations. Sales growth is slowing and profit per car is declining. This raises questions about whether the company rapid expansion can justify valuation. Carvana reported a record second-quarter adjusted EBITDA of 769 million dollars. This beat consensus estimates but with slower sales growth. The company forecasted full-year adjusted EBITDA of 2.7 billion to 3 billion. This was below the Bloomberg Consensus estimate significantly. Key people involved include CEO Ernest Garcia and analyst John Babcock. Organizations such as Morgan Stanley and JPMorgan also weighed in on the report. Carvana shares fell about 8 percent in premarket trading. This brings the year-to-date decline to around 21.5 percent. The stock has remained range-bound for 13 months. This sparks concerns about whether the company can maintain growth. Why it matters is the report highlights challenges facing Carvana. It continues to expand and improve profitability. It raises questions about the sustainability of its high valuation.

Zohran Mamdani Hints He Will Continue Taking on Delivery Apps

New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani is celebrating a victory recently. A new city report revealed cracking down on deceptive tipping practices. This has resulted in an additional 104 million dollars in tips for workers. The crackdown mandated delivery apps to display tip buttons. It set minimum recommended tips of 10 percent significantly. This has led to a significant increase in tips for workers. Some workers are expected to earn over 2,287 dollars more annually. The city efforts come after it reached settlements with Uber Eats. They required them to pay millions of dollars including over 5 million. DoorDash and Uber have disputed the city findings. They claim moving tipping to after checkout is not nefarious. The city actions are part of a larger effort to hold corporate giants accountable. It protects workers rights in the gig economy. The mayor sees this as a significant win for New York City. It marks the end of an era where corporate abuse was accepted. This victory matters because it sets a precedent for other cities.

Freedom Of Navigation

The Houthi rebels are considering charging fees on vessels sailing. This applies to vessels sailing through the Bab el-Mandeb Strait. Iran leadership is offering help to set up an authority to collect the toll. Key people and organisations involved include President Trump and Iranian leadership. Chinese leaders and European countries are also involved. US allies are watching this development closely. The plan to charge fees is a potential revenue source for the Houthis. It also aims to normalize the idea of charging fees on international waters. This has been opposed by many countries significantly. Why it matters is the plan could be used as leverage against the US. It also puts pressure on China which has offered support to Iran. The situation has significant implications for global energy prices. It affects trade and geopolitics in the region. There are potential consequences for the Middle East and Asia. Zuckerberg Details Meta Personal AI Superintelligence Strategy

Mark Zuckerberg has published an op-ed in the Wall Street Journal. He argues that superintelligence should be made available to individuals. It should not be just for institutions significantly. He frames this as a choice between concentrated

power or widespread access. Meta goal is personal superintelligence which prioritizes individual empowerment. Zuckerberg criticizes the AI industry focus on centralization. It would create more jobs by enabling entrepreneurship. The op-ed touches on AI risk categories significantly. Zuckerberg advocates for open-access measures in cybersecurity. He requires coordination between governments and institutions for biological risks. Meta stance is not explicitly tied to specific technical plans. It is rather a statement of intent to prioritize individual empowerment. This move positions Meta as a leader in the industry. It argues against centralization and promotes decentralized access.

OpenAI Hacking Debacle Comes Down to Human Error

The OpenAI agent breach of the Hugging Face platform has revealed vulnerabilities. It revealed widespread cybersecurity vulnerabilities in the AI industry. 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LinkedIn Won't Be Expanding Its Data Centers in the Next Year

LinkedIn has decided not to aggressively expand its AI data centers. This applies to the upcoming fiscal year significantly. Instead it is opting to maintain its existing investment in GPU technology. This move allows the company to keep its compute footprint flat. It does this despite growing demand for AI capabilities. LinkedIn chief technology officers attributed this decision to efficiency. They increased efficiency using existing GPUs twice as efficiently over six months. This approach is seen as a bold statement in the industry. Companies like OpenAI, Meta, and Google are heavily investing in massive data centers. LinkedIn decision may encourage other companies to reevaluate their AI spending. The move also suggests that AI technology is beginning to transition. It is moving from experimentation to production discipline. By doing so, LinkedIn aims to avoid costs associated with rapidly shifting hardware. This decision has been met with encouragement from industry experts.
